

Letter from the Board of Directors

It is not often that a community identifies a long-range problem, rallies around a plan to address it and then creates a new institution they believe will address the problem for many years to come. The volunteers and supporters who worked together to establish Friends of Lake Leelanau have done just that—in three years!

They helped breathe life into a practical solution to a complex problem—a solution which will not only provide the resources needed to protect the waters of Lake Leelanau from current threats, but from future challenges as well.

The catalyst for the community's concern was, of course, Eurasian watermilfoil (EWM), which was discovered in Lake Leelanau in 2019. This aggressive plant, classified by scientists as the single most invasive aquatic plant in North America, had already overtaken many lakes, large and small, across the continent. Thanks to the decisive and coordinated action by the Lake Leelanau Lake Association, the spread of EWM has been contained. However, the rapidly growing cost of this work quickly outstripped the Association's capacity to raise funds to pay for it. It became apparent to the community that a long-term source of funding was needed to address this and other problems the Lake might encounter in the future.

The groundwork for Friends of Lake Leelanau, an independent public foundation, was initiated in late 2021. Fundraising began in earnest in January 2022 when a Campaign Committee was formed and began work. Friends' Board and the Committee set an ambitious goal of raising an endowment of \$5 to \$8 million, the income from which may be used to counter any challenge which might threaten the lake in the future.

Thanks to the passionate engagement of many thoughtful people in the community, Friends surpassed its fundraising goal at the end of December 2024. A pledge from a generous anonymous donor pushed the Campaign across the finish line, enabling Friends to meet its stretch goal of raising \$8 million in gifts and pledges. Moreover, including investment returns, Friends' assets grew to \$9.1 million by December 31, 2024, the date the fundraising campaign concluded.

This Annual Report is dedicated to the individuals named in this report who enthusiastically embraced a transformative idea and brought it to fruition. Their hard work and commitment created a new institution: Friends of Lake Leelanau. This endowment, believed to be one of the largest of its kind to benefit a single lake in Michigan, is perhaps the greatest legacy we can all leave to our children and grandchildren—the future stewards of Lake Leelanau.

Campaign Progress Report

2024 At A Glance

The Campaign's third year of events and activities continued to raise awareness about the need for an organization with adequate resources to protect the clear blue waters of Lake Leelanau.

In addition to the fundraising gatherings the Campaign Committee organized in homes surrounding Lake Leelanau, Friends mailed several fundraising letters to local residents in the second half of 2024. The cost of these direct mail campaigns was largely generously underwritten by a contribution from **Easling Construction Company**. These solicitations raised approximately \$180,000.


By the end of 2024, Friends had received cumulative gifts and pledges totaling \$8.0 million from more than 550 donors. In addition, Friends had earned approximately \$1.1 million on its investment portfolio since inception.

PEOPLE ATTENDING FRIENDS' EVENTS IN 2022, 2023 AND 2024








The Oscars for Outstanding Production Go to...







Friends' Transition from a Fundraising to a Grant-Making Organization

From the summer of 2021 through the end of December 2024, Friends' Board of Directors focused on a single goal: raising the funds needed to make Friends' endowment sufficiently strong to be viable for many years to come.

As contributions to Friends began to grow, the Board formed an Investment Committee in August 2022 to select an investment advisor and to monitor the advisor's performance. The Investment Committee includes **Darren Keller** as well as the members of the Board. After interviewing several firms, the Investment Committee selected Sapient Capital as Friends' independent investment advisor.

Until mid-2024, Friends' board focused almost exclusively on raising capital, acknowledging and tracking gifts and pledges, managing Friends' assets, and reporting to donors. Friends' expenses were minimal.

In mid-2024 Friends' Board took steps to transition toward a grant-making organization. Most importantly, Friends expanded its Board of Directors by naming **Carol Rademacher** and **Tom Reahard** as directors. Second, the Board named **Tom Hiatt** as Executive Vice President and **Carol Rademacher** as Secretary. The Board developed a grant application and grant-making guidelines and joined the Council of Michigan Foundations.

January 1, 2025, marked the end of Friends' formal fundraising campaign and the beginning of the organization's new chapter as a grant-making organization. During the months ahead, Friends will be making changes to its website to reflect this shift in the organization's priorities. Friends' Board now meets quarterly and welcomes inquiries from any organization with the experience and capacity to help Friends achieve its mission.









Friends Awards First Grant

Following its meeting on January 15, 2025, Friends' Board of Directors announced it had approved the foundation's first grant.

Friends committed \$291,380 to the Lake Leelanau Lake Association to cover the costs of the Association's lake stewardship program in 2025. Specifically, the funds will be used to continue the Association's programs to monitor and control aquatic and terrestrial invasive species in Lake Leelanau, as well as to evaluate and potentially upgrade the Association's water quality monitoring program. In addition, grant funds will enable the Association to continue to educate residents and visitors about the importance of protecting the lake's shoreline, which acts as both a natural buffer and water filtration system to help keep Lake Leelanau's water clean and clear.

In 2019, Eurasian watermilfoil or EWM—considered by scientists as North America's most invasive and troublesome aquatic plant—was first found in Lake Leelanau. Since then, the Lake Association's budget has grown approximately tenfold. While the Association has significantly increased its fundraising activities through online auctions and a year-end appeal, this income, along with membership dues has been insufficient to cover the costs of Association's comprehensive program of preventing, monitoring and remediating EWM. Indeed, the only way the Association was able to meet these costs in 2022, 2023 and 2024 was through charitable contributions from **Jennie and Darren Keller**, who largely covered the costs of the Lake Association's program to control aquatic invasive species during the period while Friends was being formed.

Friends' grant, which will be paid in quarterly installments, is expected to cover approximately 60% of the Association's projected operating budget in 2025. The mission of Friends of Lake Leelanau is to protect the waters of Lake Leelanau in perpetuity. Friends accomplishes this goal through an endowment, the income which is distributed to organizations focused on improving the aquatic health of Lake Leelanau. Founded in 2021, Friends has approximately 550 donors.

The mission of the Lake Leelanau Lake Association is to protect and enhance the quality and beauty of Lake Leelanau and its surrounding watershed for current and future generations. Established in 1980, the Association currently has approximately 575 members.



Type of Nonprofit

Foundation

The Foundation was established to provide financing to organizations with the capacity to address challenges or threats which may adversely affect Lake Leelanau and its watershed, including, for example, the prevention, monitoring, and control of invasive species. Gifts to the Foundation are invested in an endowment fund.

Association

Donations, grants and membership dues help fund the Association's programs to protect and preserve Lake Leelanau. These programs include preventing, monitoring, and removing aquatic invasive species, constructing boat cleaning stations, monitoring water quality, protecting the shoreline, and educating individuals on lake stewardship.



Finances

\$9,000,000

At a 4.5% spend rate, an \$9 million endowment is expected to generate approximately \$405,000 in annual income. Friends' made its first grant to the Lake Association in January 2025: \$291,000, which accounts for approximately 60% of the Association's 2025 operating budget.

\$500,000

The Association's annual budget of approximately \$500,000 funds the nonprofit's lake stewardship activities. Approximately two-thirds of the Association's annual budget, or more than \$300,000, is spent on the stewardship activities described above.

The Foundation is governed by five board members:

Friends' Board of Directors invites grant requests from qualified organizations which have a demonstrated capability to manage programs protect Lake Leelanau. The Lake Association is governed by a 22-member board of directors and guided by four officers:

- Laurie Wilkins, Vice President and Treasurer
- · Greg Vogt, Secretary
- · Tom Hiatt, Past President

In addition, a number of other individuals with experience in finance, lake ecology, law, government, communications and business serve on the Association's committees and task forces. The Association is also supported by approximately 75 volunteers who help implement its programs.



Governance

Supporting Lake Leelanau for the *long-term* Friends was formed to raise, invest, grant and monitor its financial contributions to other organizations. It does not plan to engage directly in program management. The Association and other organizations have the capacity to develop and implement programs to protect the health and beauty of Lake Leelanau. Although Friends and the Lake Association share many common supporters, the two organizations are distinct legal entities which operate independently. Friends' independence provides it the flexibility to grant funds to any organization which is uniquely qualified to protect the health of Lake Leelanau.

2024 Financial Report

2024 was the third and final year of Friends' successful three-year campaign to raise an endowment with at least \$8 million in assets. The funds raised have been used to establish an endowment fund, from which Friends makes grants to other organizations with the experience and capacity to protect Lake Leelanau and whose goals are consistent with Friends' mission.

As of December 31, 2024, 550 donors had given or pledged \$8 million. This compares to 351 donors who had given or pledged \$7.2 million at the end of 2023, and to 168 donors who had given or pledged \$5.7 million at the end of 2022.

In addition, Friends' investment portfolio has earned approximately \$1.1 million in dividends and interest from inception through December 31, 2024, bringing Friends' assets at the end of fiscal 2024 to \$9.1 million—an amount which includes both paid and unpaid pledges as well as investment returns.

Friends' assets of \$9.1 million at the end of 2024 compared to assets of \$7.7 million at the end of 2023 and assets of \$3.1 million at the end of 2022.

Of the \$9.1 million in assets on December 31, 2024, outstanding pledges accounted for approximately \$765,000, compared to \$1.8 million at the end of 2023. Many of the remaining pledges will be paid over the next two or three years, although several pledges have a longer payment period. At the end of 2024, past due pledges totaled less than \$7,000 of total outstanding pledges.

Friends' fundraising expenses have been minimal. Friends does not maintain a physical office. Friends' Board members receive no compensation and Friends has no paid staff. Friends' largest expenses are for investment management fees, which are provided at a discounted rate, and audit services. Total investment management fees were approximately \$33,600 in 2024. The gains on Friends' investment portfolio reported above are net of investment management fees.

Friends had no outstanding liabilities at the end of 2024. Please note that the above numbers for 2024 are preliminary and unaudited. Gabridge & Company of Traverse City will audit Friends' financials in the first or second quarter of 2025. Once completed, the 2024 audit will be posted to Friends' website, www.friendsoflakeleelanau.org.



Investment Committee and Investment Management

Friends' Board of Directors established an Investment Committee in 2022. The Committee met quarterly in 2024. The members of the Committee are Jim Grogan, Tom Hiatt, Jennie Keller, Darren Keller, Carol Rademacher and Tom Reahard. Sapient Capital, a privately owned, independent advisory firm with more than \$11 billion in assets under management, manages Friends' assets. Sapient's clients include nonprofit organizations, as well as families, individuals, foundations and other institutions. Sapient is headquartered in Indianapolis with offices in Los Angeles, Miami and New York. Friends' account manager at Sapient is Michael Hall, Partner. Friends' Investment Committee and Board of Directors have adopted a target annual "spend rate" of no greater than 4.5% of the endowment's current assets. At this rate, an endowment with current assets of \$9 million will generate approximately \$405,000 in annual "spendable" income. This means Friends may make annual grants up to this amount and still be reasonably confident that the endowment's investment returns will outpace the spend rate, enabling Friends' endowment to continue to grow over time.

2025 and Beyond

Friends' Board of Directors will meet quarterly in January, March, June and September 2025 to consider new grant requests as well as monitor the activities of current grantees.

The Board will review the summary and, assuming there is an interest in learning more, will provide applicants a more detailed grant application.

Jennie Keller President

Jennie is a co-founder of Friends and has served as the President of its Board of Directors since the organization's founding. A longtime owner and investor in various businesses, primarily in the healthcare sector, Jennie's true passion lies in philanthropy. Through her leadership of the Celebrate Life Foundation and other charitable organizations, she has supported clinical cancer research, healthcare innovation, individual freedom and liberty, and initiatives to help strengthen the communities where she and her family live and work. Jennie and her family consider Leland their "happy place," and she is proud to contribute to the protection of Lake Leelanau. Jennie holds a B.A. in Communications from DePauw University.



Tom Hiatt Executive Vice President

Tom is a co-founder of Friends and serves as Executive Vice President of Friends' Board. During the course of his business career, Tom was a Founding Partner of Centerfield Capital, a private equity firm which has raised and invested more than \$1 billion in risk capital. Representing Centerfield, Tom served as a director of a number of private and publicly held companies, including firms in the fields of financial services, health care, manufacturing, information technology and business services. Tom began his career as an administrator with the Ford Foundation. He has played a key role starting and building several nonprofit organizations in fields ranging from entrepreneurship to environmental protection. Over the years he has served on the boards of Newfields (formerly the Indianapolis Museum of Art), The Indiana Nature Conservancy, and the Lilly Family School of Philanthropy at Indiana University. He currently serves as a member of the board of the Leelanau Lake Association and was the Association's President from 2018 through 2022. Tom, his wife, Nora, and their children have vacationed in Leelanau County for four decades and became homeowners in 2012. Tom received a B.A. from Wabash College, a M.Sc. from the Sloan School of Management of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and a M.A. in Philanthropic Studies from Indiana University.



Jim Grogan Vice President and Treasurer

Jim is a co-founder of Friends and has held the positions of Vice President and Treasurer of Friends' Board since its inception. As an attorney and successful businessman, Jim brings a distinguished record of leadership within both private and public sectors as well as civic and charitable organizations. His notable roles include being appointed by the Governor of Arizona to Chair the Board of the Arizona Tourism and Sports Authority, a public entity established to promote tourism and oversee the design, construction, ownership, and operation of a multi-purpose facility that hosts the NFL Cardinals amongst a myriad of other activities. Additionally, Jim has consistently supported Leland charities throughout his life, embodying the principles of his Jesuit education that emphasizes "men and women for others." In 2021, Tom transitioned the leadership of Symmetry to his daughter, Elizabeth. Tom continues to share his expertise by consulting with startups, running a small venture of his own, and embracing his newfound passion for drawing, an example of which is shown below. Tom has dedicated much of his personal time to charitable organizations. At Symmetry, Tom led "Calculators for Kids", a program which donated thousands of calculators to Arizona schools.
